Andhra Pradesh govt fast-tracks processes to implement Rs.819 bln PBLP

The state government has fast-tracked all processes to get the Rs.819 billion Polavaram-Banakacherla Link Project (PBLP) moving at the earliest. The project seeks to supply water to state's arid regions. Within days of the state government submitting its project proposal to the Union environment ministry for environmental clearance, the latter's Expert Appraisal Committee for River Valley Projects is set to examine it for approval soon.
